



Honoring Those Who Have Fallen

One of the highlights of my recent visit to Washington D.C. was the reflective moments spent at the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial. The Memorial features two curving, 304 foot marble walls. Carved on these walls are the names of the more than 19,000 officers who have been killed in the line of duty throughout U.S. history. Each of the four pathway entrances to the Memorial walls are adorned with a statue of a lion protecting its cubs. The statues symbolize the protective role of law officers and convey strength, courage and valor that are the hallmarks of those who serve. The memorial is ever-changing with new names of fallen officers added each spring in conjunction with National Police Week.
