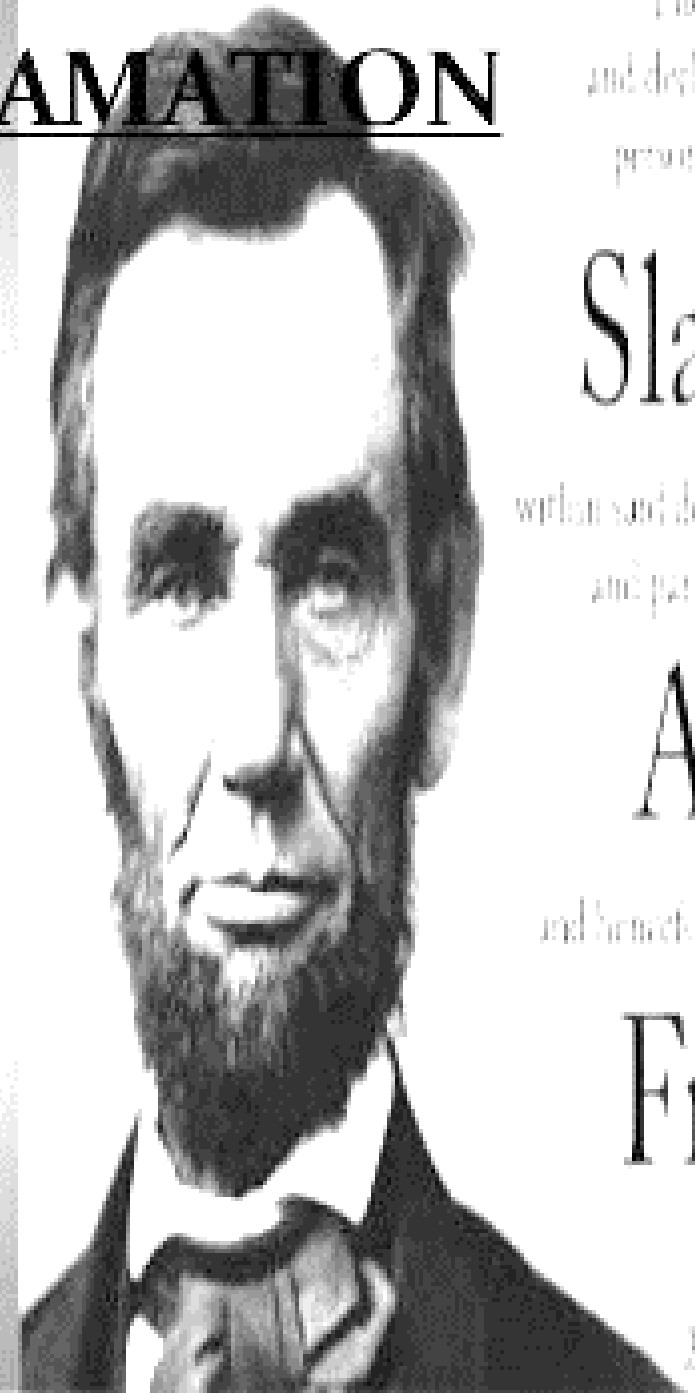


THE EMANCIPATION PROCLAMATION

- January 1st 1863 President Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation legally ending slavery in the Confederate States.
- The support that grew after the Emancipation Proclamation was issued strengthened the northern states with many more soldiers.
- April 9th 1865 southern confederate states surrendered.

Our Emancipation Proclamation

Romans 6:6-14

Know

Romans 6:6 For we know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body ruled by sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves to sin—⁷ because anyone who has died has been set free from sin.

- the penalty of sin (2 Corinthians 5:12)
- the power of sin (1 Corinthians 10:13)
- the presence of sin

Philippians 3:10 I want to know Christ and experience the mighty power that raised him from the dead.

Our Emancipation Proclamation

Romans 6:6-14

Teach me Thy way, O Lord, teach me Thy way!
Thy guiding grace afford, teach me Thy way!
Help me to walk aright, more by faith, less by sight;
Lead me with heav'nly light, teach me Thy way!

Long as my life shall last, teach me Thy way!
Where'er my lot be cast, teach me Thy way!

Until the race is run, until the journey's done,
Until the crown is won, teach me Thy way!

Our Emancipation Proclamation

Romans 6:6-14

Count

¹¹ In the same way, count yourselves dead to sin but alive to God in Christ Jesus.

- Key term - used 19 times in Romans
- The Greek word is *logizomi* – the sense is to reflect upon, to reason through all of what been said in chapters 1-5.
- A present tense imperative. The first command in Romans.

Romans 6:6-14

Offer

¹² Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. ¹³ Do not offer any part of yourself to sin as an instrument of wickedness, but rather offer yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life; and offer every part of yourself to him as an instrument of righteousness. ¹⁴ For sin shall no longer be your master, because you are not under the law, but under grace.
